ANT 245: BIOLOGICAL ANTHROPOLOGY

In this course, concepts, theory, and methods of biological anthropology are surveyed in lecture and laboratory. Emphasis is placed on the role of evolution in explaining past and present variation among non-human primates, human ancestors, and modern humans. In lab sections of the course, students will focus on data collection and analysis related to heredity, population genetics, skeletal and dental variation, evolutionary change, and modern physical variation.
