

## 2024-25 ACADEMIC COURSES

### ANT 290: INTERNATIONAL STUDIES IN ANTHROPOLOGY

In this course, students will focus on a particular sub-field of Anthropology (cultural, archaeology, bioarchaeology, primatology) at an international location that will involve both classroom and hands-on learning opportunities. The classroom component of the course will involve 1-2 weeks of lecture and/or labs before travel commences. The hands-on component of the course will involve travel abroad that includes cultural immersion, visits to relevant museums and landmarks, and hands-on participation at a fieldwork site. Level I Prerequisite: Academic Reading and Writing Levels of 6; Level II Prerequisite: ANT 205 minimum grade "C"; ANT 245 or ANT 265, minimum grade "C"
