In this course, students will discover the history and evolution of graphic design from prehistoric mark-making to the vibrant visual landscape we see around us today. The subject is viewed in the context of relevant social, technological, economic, and cultural events such as the origins of the alphabet, the invention of printing, and the birth of desktop publishing. Although the course focuses on graphic design and visual communication systems, it stresses connections to related disciplines such as architecture, industrial design, photography, and the traditional fine arts.
