NUR 288 : NURSING CONCEPTS IV

In this course, students will demonstrate clinical judgment in collaboration with the interprofessional team to prioritize safe, quality care for patients with multisystem and emergent health problems. Students will expand their knowledge and usage of psychomotor, affective and cognitive skills in the management of patient assignments through clinical and simulation experiences across the lifespan in a variety of settings. Students will synthesize knowledge of nursing principles and concepts and begin to refine their professional nursing roles. Emphasis is placed on clinical reasoning and clinical judgment in the integration of care for up to three complex patients in the clinical and simulation lab environment. Students prepare for the National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN) exam and participate in a 3-day NCLEX Preparatory workshop.
