### RAD 112 : RADIOGRAPHY POSITIONING I

In this course, students are introduced to the theories and practices that are utilized in the clinical setting to produce diagnostic radiographs of the chest, abdomen and upper extremities. Radiographic terminology, patient preparation, patient positioning, proper manipulation of radiographic equipment, radiation safety practices, image evaluation, professional standards and medical ethics will be discussed and practiced in the laboratory setting.

**Level I Prereq:** Academic Reading and Writing Levels of 6; RAD 101 and RAD 110, minimum grade "C-"; RAD 101 and RAD 110 may enroll concurrently
